Like many artists in her generation, Patricia Van Dalen's recent works deal with the legacy of modernism and proposes a dialog between abstraction and pure representation.

In her recent paintings, primary color-charged landscapes are later cut in stripes in the first stage of denying her own act of having created, as she would say, "the illusion of something new."

The stripes of color are then superimposed onto another painted canvas. They create a grid pattern over the underlying painting producing a confusing perception that has a dense optical effect, close in spirit, to the intentions of kinetic geometric artists of the 1950s. The "reading" of the painting has now been interrupted. Unrelated painted fragments dominate the space with no other apparent purpose than to provoke the experience of Epicurean visual joy.

In recent years, Van Dalen's research has led her to work to the "en plein air." Following the logic of her collage compositions, Van Dalen skips phase one so the landscape itself becomes the background for her stripes. In the Fairchild project, these are methodically arranged to suggest a bar code shape.

Color is given by tens of thousands of orange, red and pink vinyl marker flags.
Those "brushstrokes" are to be suspended one foot over the Garden's central lawn to create a mirage.

The 14 stripes are 250 feet long and 10 feet wide to form a 62,500 square-foot composition. The bars are perfectly aligned with the cardinal points: North and South.

In so doing, the artist imposes a square—the most culturally charged shape—on nature and on the organic design of the Garden. However rigorous, the composition is overwhelmingly dominated by the spirit of joy and even fun, a key element that Van Dalen further exploits by handing visitors 3D Chroma-Depth glasses that provide the viewer with a surprising added value.



